What have we been up to?

We continue to welcome new families and children into Lairdsland Early Years Centre. New children have been settling in and becoming familiar with their nursery routine.

Some children have been actively exploring the outdoor environment and becoming involved in bird watching. Some children discovered the small birds like to eat seeds and small pieces of bread. The children were excited to watch and count how many birds they could see as they landed onto the bird table. Some children have been exploring volume and forces using water outdoors to pour, fill, empty and make objects move.

Most children are involved in daily baking experiences and will sometimes take what they have made home, and other times children enjoy what has been made for afternoon snack.

Our nursey provision offers a wide range of experiences to encourage children to develop their social interaction skills, independence and problem solving skills.

Creative play helps children flourish as confident, resilient and happy individuals and it is vital for child development. Creativity is a key ingredient for children to learn how to follow their curiosity, solve problems and make sense of the world. Our Creative Journey (Care Inspectorate 2017)

PAThS Programme: Promoting Alternative Thinking Strategies

PAThS, is designed to facilitate the development of self-control, emotional awareness and problem-solving skills. Pre-school children can take part in our PAThS programme. Children have been learning about reciprocity in giving and receiving compliments.
