Readina The children will be using Bug

Club or Storyworld reading schemes. Bug Club readers can access books online. Details of website and passwords can be found at the front of homework jotters. Storyworld books will be sent home forming part of the weekly Primary 3 homework. Children's reading and

comprehension will be assessed at the end of each stage.

Children will also be encouraged to choose books to read for personal enjoyment.



Writing

During term 1, Primary 3 will be continuing to use VCOP to develop their writing. This includes using powerful openers, connectives and introducing new punctuation. Writing activities will be based around our

Talk For Writing scheme which uses sample texts the children can use as a base to develop their writing skills.



<u>Maths</u>

This term, the children will be revising numbers to 100 and begin working with numbers up to 1000. This is will be challenging work and we will be doing lots of practise to embed the skills, such as numbers before and after, adding and subtracting units, tens and hundreds, and sequencing. We will be using the 100 courses the numbers is the subtracting units. square to support our teaching. They will also be learning about information handling covering bar graphs and tally charts. The children will also practise their mental maths skills during the week and will be assessed on a Friday morning.

Additional Information

Spelling/Phonics Spelling will be taught weekly and will involve a number of interactive tasks during lessons . Spelling homework will be handed out on Monday. The children should write their words twice more at home using SACAWAC (say and cover and write and check) and do one activity from the spelling grid at the back o'f their jotter. There is a weekly spelling test on a Friday morning.
